CONSTITUTIONAL PROVISIONS

Article I, Section 8, Clause 18: Congress shall have the power to exercise the authority vested in the States by the Tenth Amendment to the Constitution.

Article II, Section 4, Clause 1: The President, Vice President and all civil Officers and Judges shall hold their Offices during the Term of Years specified in this Article, but no Person shall be elected to either of those Offices more than once.

Article III, Section 2, Clause 2: The Trial, of all Crimes, except in Cases of Impeachment, shall be held before the Supreme Court, or such other Court as the Congress may, from time to time, ordain and establish.

Article IV, Section 4, Clause 1: The United States shall guarantee to every State in this Union a Republican Form of Government.

Article V, Section 1, Clause 1: The Congress, whenever two thirds of both Houses shall so require, shall propose Amendments to this Constitution, or on the Application of the States, two thirds of all States shall propose Amendments to this Constitution, which in either Case, shall be valid to all Intents and Purposes, when ratified by three fourths of all the States.

Article VI, Section 2, Clause 3: The Senators and Representatives before mentioned, and the Members of the several State Legislatures, and all executive and judicial Officers, both State and National, when they shall have taken the Oath of Office, shall be bound by it, as well under the Sanctions of Heaven, as under the Penal Laws of the United States.

Article VII, Section 1, Clause 1: The ratification of thirteen States shall be sufficient for the Establishment of this Constitution between the States so ratifying the same.

Article VIII, Section 1, Clause 1: All Debts contracted and paid by the United States, and all Debts contracted by the United States before the 4th of March 1792, shall remain the same as if this Constitution had not taken Effect.

Article IX, Section 1, Clause 1: No State shall be deprived of its equal Suffrage in the Senate.

Article X, Section 1, Clause 1: No State shall enter into any Treaty, Alliance, or Confederation, or State shall enter into any Agreement or Compact with another State, or with a foreign State, or with the United States, without the Consent of the Congress, provided that such Consent shall not be required in Case of an Alliance or Confederation.

Article XI, Section 1, Clause 1: No State shall, without the Consent of the Congress, lay any Imposts or Duties on Imports or Exports, except those which may be absolutely necessary to the Execution of its Laws, and the Taxation of Imports and Exports, shall be in no Manner discriminatory.

Article XII, Section 1, Clause 1: The Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in that State.

Article XIII, Section 1, Clause 1: No State shall be deprived of its equal Suffrage in the House of Representatives.

Article XIV, Section 1, Clause 1: All Persons born or naturalized in the United States, and who, when they came to this Country, were in the Service of the United States, shall be Citizens of the United States; and the Citizens of each State shall be Citizens of the United States.

Article XV, Section 1, Clause 1: No State shall deny the Equal Rights of Citizens of the United States to the same Privileges and Immunities as are enjoyed by Citizens of the United States.

Article XVI, Section 1, Clause 1: No State shall, without the Consent of the Congress, lay any Tax or Duty on the Importation of Foreign Goods, or on the Exportation of any Commodity, or on the Commerce between the States, or on the Commerce with any foreign State.

Article XVII, Section 1, Clause 1: The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for the Term of Six Years; and they shall have the same Qualifications, and the same Powers, as the Senators of the United States under the former Constitution.

Article XVIII, Section 1, Clause 1: No State shall, without the Consent of the Congress, lay any Tax or Duty on the Importation of Foreign Goods, or on the Exportation of any Commodity, or on the Commerce between the States, or on the Commerce with any foreign State.

Article XIX, Section 1, Clause 1: The right of Citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any State on account of Sex.

Article XX, Section 1, Clause 1: No State shall, without the Consent of the Congress, lay any Tax or Duty on the Importation of Foreign Goods, or on the Exportation of any Commodity, or on the Commerce between the States, or on the Commerce with any foreign State.

Article XXI, Section 1, Clause 1: No State shall, without the Consent of the Congress, lay any Tax or Duty on the Importation of Foreign Goods, or on the Exportation of any Commodity, or on the Commerce between the States, or on the Commerce with any foreign State.
