INTRODUCTION

HISTORY AND GEOGRAPHICAL LOCATION OF THE UNIT

The research unit 1048 SAD-APT is a Mixed Research Unit (UMR) created in 1999. SADAPT stands for "Science pour I'Action et le Développement: Activités, Produits, Territoires". INRA and AgroParisTech are the supervising institutions. Within INRA, SAD-APT belongs to the SAD Division (Sciences for Action and Development) and to the SAE2 Division (Social Science, Agriculture and Food, Rural Development and Environment). Within AgroParisTech, the teaching and research staff is primarily attached to the SIAFEE Division (Science and Engineering for Agronomy, Forestry, Water and the Environment) and SVS (Health and Life Sciences) and more marginally to the SESG Division (Economics, Social and Management Sciences).

The unit is located at three sites: Paris, Thiverval-Grignon and Ivry-sur-Seine. Having several locations results from the different AgroParisTech sites and from the integration of members of the SAE2 division based in Ivry-sur-Seine. In 2021, the unit will move to the Saclay campus of Université Paris-Saclay.

SCIENTIFIC DOMAIN

SADAPT has an interdisciplinary approach, with an emphasis on socio-economic contributions to the development of future food systems at the landscape level. Three teams are involved in the project. The URBAN AGRICULTURE team works on peri-urban and urban food production and investigates the organisation of food systems in this context, involving also production aspects. The team CONCEPTS investigates the conceptual development of future agro-ecological systems and pays particular attention to the integration of livestock. The team PROXIMITIES analyses the socio-economic aspects of agricultural development in both, rural and peri-urban areas.

GLOBAL ASSESSMENT OF THE INTERDISCIPLINARY UNIT

The SAD-APT Unit is highly productive and meets international standards in terms of publications and project acquisition. It occupies a strategic position, both nationally and internationally, for the development of agro-ecological approaches and their implementation and evaluation at farm and landscape scale. SAD-APT covers the whole range of research activities, from fundamental/conceptual research to applied contributions. Further engaging in policy support and in participatory research might increase its impact. SAD-APT does well in teaching, training and PhD supervision and needs to take care to maintain those activities through strategic support of younger staff to undergo the preparation of their HDR diploma. SAD-APT actively works towards its integration of the Saclay Campus and now needs a strategic plan to anticipate the expected fluctuations of personnel (also due to retirement), not only of scientists but also of technical and support staff. An operational plan to maintain and strengthen the communication and planning among the unit members during the transfer to Saclay should be put together, supporting the unit director with this task. SAD-APT has developed a new project with 4 transversal axes. This is a major achievement and the unit should now capitalize on the momentum it has created.
